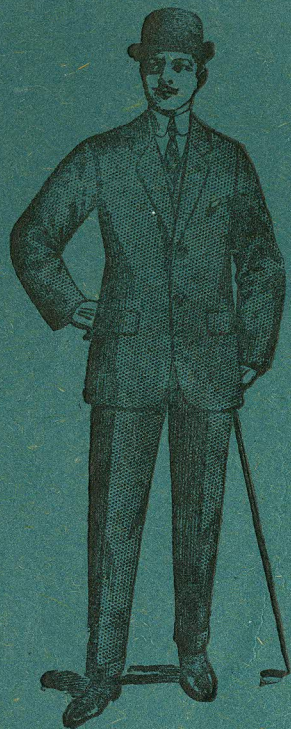

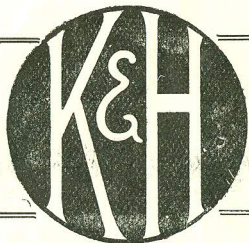

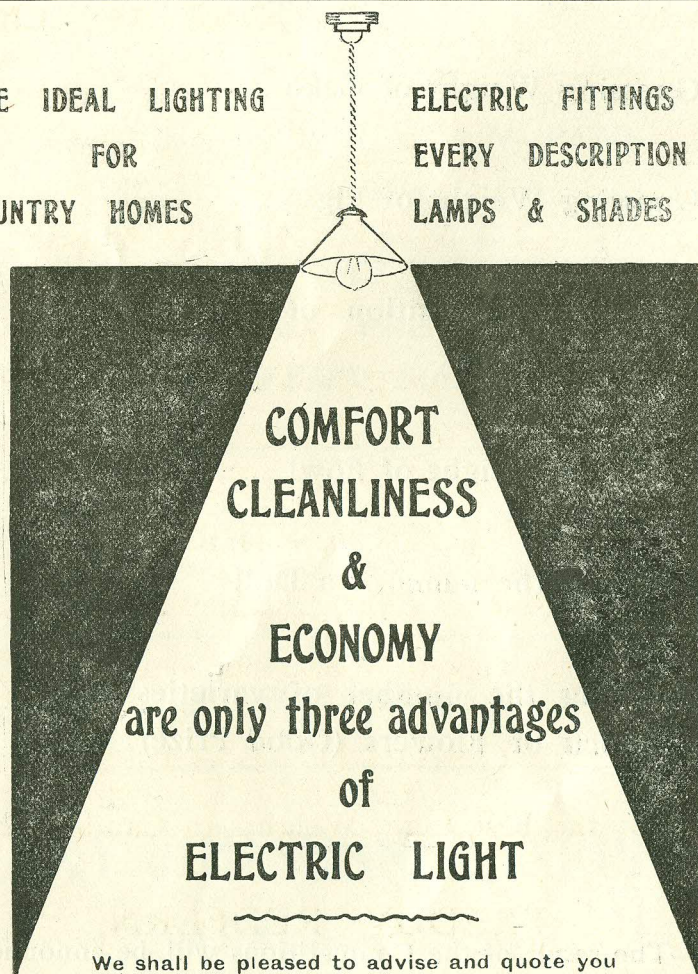

SYNOPSIS—

THE villagers of Harston hear that their Queen—Margaret of Anjou—is passing through the village on her way to Cambridge to visit her newly founded College of Queens'.

The people gather at the ford near the old mill, and then proceed to the Monastery gate where the Queen is to be welcomed by the Abbot and the Squire. Here they indulge in some rough horse play until rebuked by the Abbot who suddenly appears at the head of his monks.

The Squire and his ladies together with the Prior of Barnwell and the President elect of Queens, arrive a moment later, just in time to greet the Queen. She appears with Lady Gloucester, Lady Suffolk and her retinue.

The Queen speaks to the people after which she proceeds them to the Mill House where a feast has been prepared.

The Hobby Horse introduced into The Mediaeval Revels is one used at Padstow in Cornwall, and can still be seen there on May Day.

Its history is a curious one.

It seems that during an early seige of Calais Padstow manned and equipped two ships which were sent to fight against the French. During their absence a hostile French ship appeared outside Padstow and the Cornish women, there being no men left to protect the shores, determined to do what they could to frighten away the enemy. They put on their red cloaks and accompanied by a man dressed up as a horrible demon they danced on the edge of the cliff. The French sailors on seeing them, imagined that the town was protected by a devil surrounded by flames and sailed away.
